Apprenticeship Training Representative and Business Services Representative Training Series

The Center is hosting a series of Apprenticeship Training Representative (ATR) and Business Services Representative (BSR) training workshops designed to (1) increase BSR awareness of Registered Apprenticeship (RA) and (2) increase ATR awareness of the workforce system. The goal of the training series is

Celebrating Youth Apprenticeship Week 2024



During the inaugural <u>Youth Apprenticeship Week</u>, the Center teamed with the <u>Next Level Now (NLN)</u> <u>Collaborative</u>, the U.S. Department of Labor's Employment and Training's TA hub, to co-present <u>Investing in America Agenda: Registered</u> <u>Apprenticeship and Other Pathways for</u> <u>Opportunity Youth</u>.

Facilitated by Sara Hastings, Unit Chief of DOL ETA's Division of Youth Services, the webinar provided a comprehensive overview of the Investing in America Agenda (IAA), showcasing real-life examples of how communities and workforce systems can collaborate effectively to maximize resources. Center's apprenticeship subject matter expert (SME), Alan Dodkowitz, and NLN Project Director and workforce system SME, Melissa A. Aguilar-Southard, laid out how workforce boards and key stakeholders can leverage funds to support Opportunity Youth in new or expanded IAA-related RA programs and other career pathways. Over 800 workforce professionals attended the live event, which was recorded and has been accessed by 6225 viewers on **WorkforceGPS**.

Investing in American Agenda and Opportunity Youth





The Center's RA and workforce subject matter experts Melissa Aguilar-Southard and Alan Dodkowitz presented on <u>How the Investing in America Agenda (IAA) Can</u> <u>Provide Registered Apprenticeship Pathways for Opportunity Youth</u> at two key workforce conferences this spring - the Southeastern Employment and Training Association (SETA) Spring Conference in Cherokee, NC, and the National Youth Employment Coalition Annual Forum in Atlanta, GA. 


