Supporting the State of Maryland's 2030 Youth Apprenticeship Goals



To help employers build stronger talent pipelines, the state of Maryland has set an ambitious goal that by the 2030-2031 school year, 45% of graduating seniors should complete an apprenticeship or earn an industry-recognized credential. Reaching this goal requires a significant expansion of youth apprenticeship across the state.

During the <u>Maryland Workforce Association's</u> annual Raising the Bar Conference, the Center presented "<u>Building Student Awareness of Apprenticeship Career</u> <u>Pathways to Meet MDs Ambitious Goals</u>." This presentation showcases data and statistics highlighting the impact and success rates of RA programs and benefits for employers and students in combining traditional education with RA. Industry experts also share examples of successful education-to-apprenticeship pathways.

U.S. DOL Announces \$6M in Grants to Expand Job Opportunities for Women in Apprenticeships, Nontraditional Occupations



U.S. DOL announced the award of <u>\$6 million in</u> funding to help recruit, train, and retain more women in quality pre-apprenticeship and RA programs, as well as in nontraditional occupations.

The Women in Apprenticeship and Nontraditional Occupations (WANTO) grants will enable organizations in eight states and D.C. to provide

training programs in fields where women are traditionally underrepresented, such as

construction, advanced manufacturing, energy, technology, and transportation.

Apprenticeship For America New State Policy Report

The nonprofit Apprenticeship for America (AFA) recently released a report on "<u>How</u> <u>States are Driving the Expansion of</u> <u>Apprenticeships: State Apprenticeship</u> <u>Policy Scan</u>."



AFA analyzed data to identify growth trends at the state level, gathered information on legislation, policy, and executive activities, and interviewed state leaders. AFA recommended five promising practices:

- 1. Set targets for apprenticeship growth.
- 2. Use a pay-for-apprenticeship, formula-based funding approach to sustain and grow apprenticeships.
- 3. Partner with intermediaries to reduce the bureaucratic burdens and friction for employers in starting and running apprenticeship programs.
- 4. Set apprenticeship requirements in state public works contracts.
- 5. Set hiring rules, policies, and targets to use the public sector as a trailblazer for apprenticeships.

Maryland Apprenticeship Connector Launches 'Apprentice Connect' To Strengthen Statewide Workforce Pipeline



Maryland Apprenticeship Connector recently launched <u>Apprentice</u> <u>Connect</u>, a new website

designed to serve as a comprehensive resource for employers, educators, and career seekers interested in Maryland's apprenticeship opportunities.

Funded by the Maryland State Department of Education's Maryland Works Grant, Apprentice Connect helps employers find critical information on how apprenticeships can be integrated into talent pipeline strategies to recruit, train, and retain a skilled workforce. Educators can explore how to bring work-based learning into the classroom to prepare students for career success, whether or not they pursue traditional college paths. The site also helps career seekers explore apprenticeship opportunities and gain a clear understanding of the skills and support needed to succeed.
