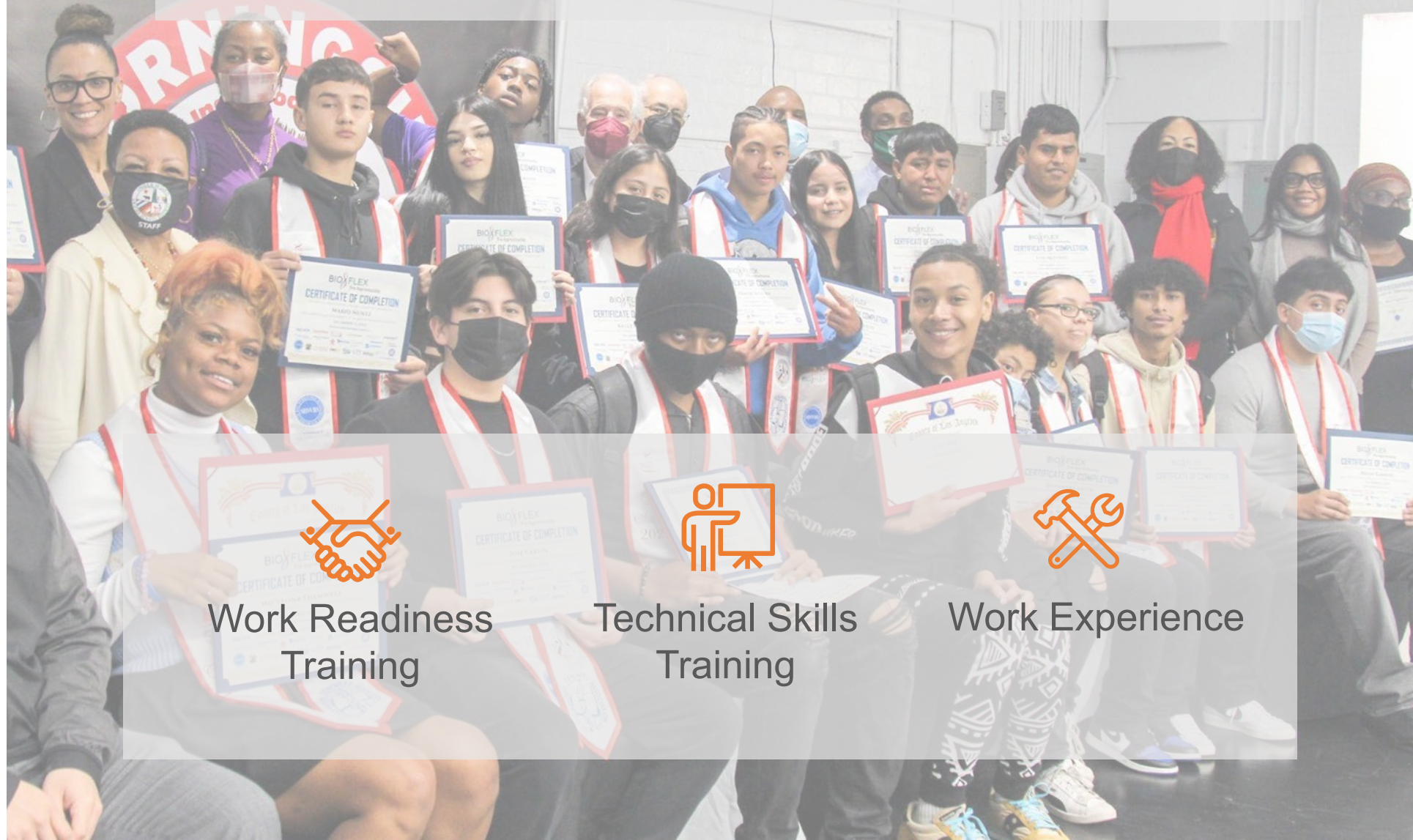

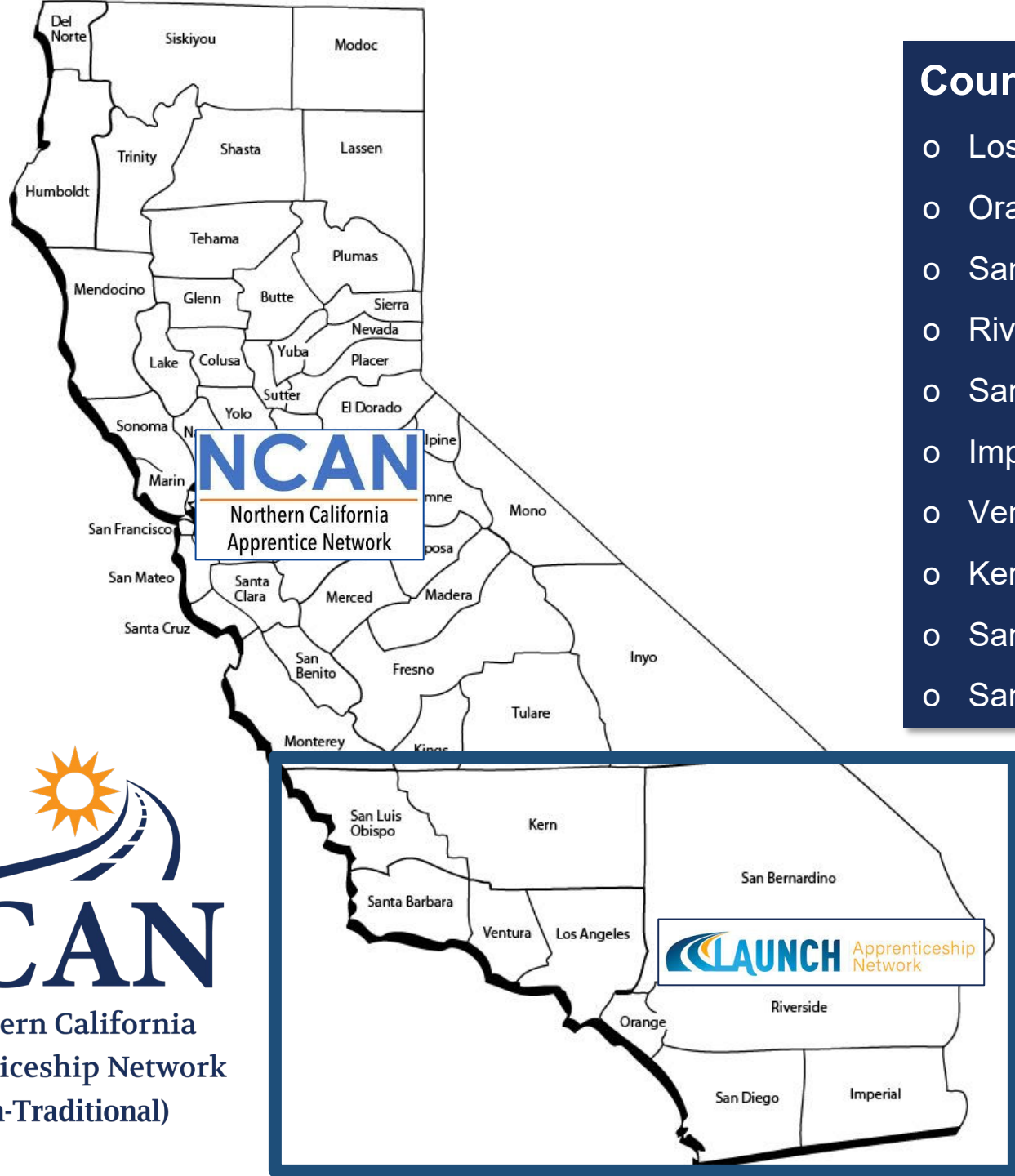


PURPOSE
